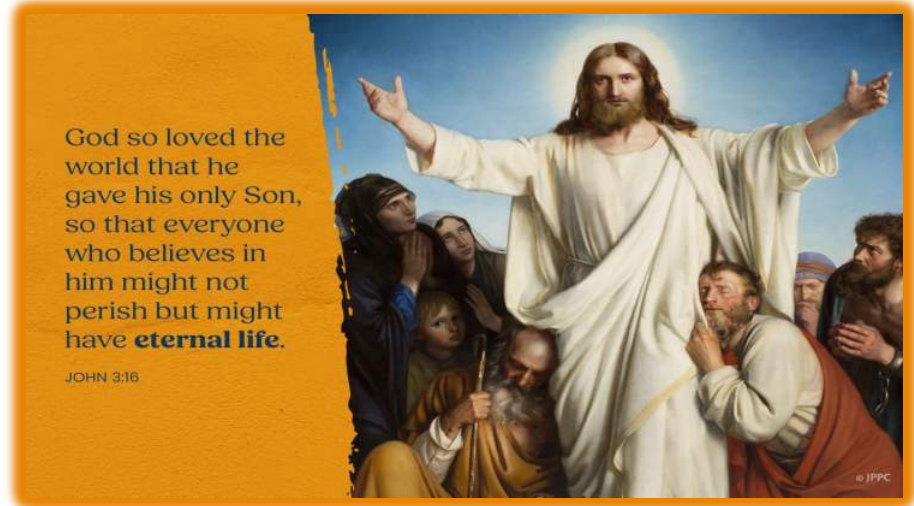

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear Family!

Happy Trinity Sunday to all of you! The Doctrine of Trinity is called a ‘mystery’ because this truth can never be known by reason alone. Only God can reveal the truth to us (CCC 261). The Doctrine of Trinity is not unique to Christianity: it transcends all religion and is a key ingredient of universal life and culture (Diarmuid Murchu). The Trimoorthy of Hinduism, the Buddhist doctrine of the three bodies, the Zoroastrian triplicate of Zurvan, the Egyptian cult of Isis, Seraphis and the divine child Horus and some thirty thousand years of traditional Trinitarian worship in the prehistoric times all point to the same One God seen in three persons.

We all possess a certain ‘nature’ when we say, ‘it’s my nature’. A person can possess a nature and not the other way around. ‘Person’ and ‘nature’ answer two different questions. ‘What is it?’ – NATURE. ‘Who is it?’ – PERSON. Further, we all can understand that our nature decides what is possible for us persons. I the person; nature is the source of our operations (F J Sheed). The same is applied to the Trinity. What we should be careful here is that 1. These three persons don’t share the divine nature 33.333, 2. They are distinct but not separate.

The doctrine can only make sense if it is understood in terms of Love and not in terms of administration. It is not about fixing, rather loving. “The ancient wisdom that we share is: everything is created out of relatedness, sustained through relationships and thrives on interdependence”. If God is love, God teaches us what love is all about; what relationships are all about and what inter-dependence is all about! Thus, we turn to Trinity for all those answers. Trinity is all about love and unity in fullness.

Saint John Paul II taught us, “A great mystery, a mystery of love, an ineffable mystery, before which words must give way to the silence of wonder and worship. A divine mystery that challenges and involves us, because a share in the Trinitarian life was given to us through grace, through the redemptive Incarnation of the Word and the gift of the Holy Spirit.” (March 17, 1999)

DEACON'S CORNER

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Homily for the Solemnity of the Most Holy

Trinity Gospel: Gospel of John

Today the Church celebrates one of the deepest mysteries of our faith: the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity — one God in three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Many people think the Trinity is only a theological idea that is difficult to understand. But the Trinity is not simply a doctrine to study. The Trinity is the way God loves.

In today's Gospel, Jesus says:

“For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son...”

Everything begins with love. The Father loves the world so much that He gives His Son. The Son loves the Father so much that He gives His life on the Cross. And the Holy Spirit is poured into our hearts so we can live in that same divine love.

The Trinity teaches us that God is not loneliness. God is communion. God is relationship. God is eternal love. And because we are created in the image of God, we are also made for love, unity, and communion.

This is why division, hatred, pride, and selfishness destroy the human heart. We were not created to live isolated from God or from one another.

In the Gospel, Jesus also says:

“God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.”

Sometimes people imagine God as distant, angry, or waiting to punish us. But Jesus reveals the true face of the Father: a God who seeks to save, forgive, heal, and restore.

The Cross is the greatest proof of the Trinity's love. The Father sends the Son.

The Son offers Himself. The Holy Spirit gives us the grace to believe and be transformed.

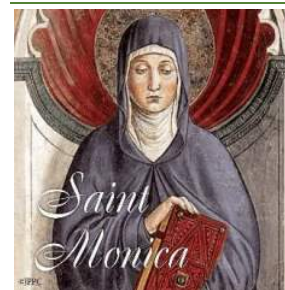
Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we proclaim this mystery: “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” Notice we do not say “names,” but “name” — because God is One. The Sign of the Cross is not just something we do mechanically. It is a profession of faith. It reminds us who God is and who we belong to. We were baptized in the name of the Trinity. We pray in the name of the Trinity. And one day, by God's mercy, we hope to live forever in the eternal communion of the Trinity.

St. Pope John Paul II taught 82 Catechesis (General Audiences) on Holy Spirit. As Pope reminds us to pray for peace in these troubled times of war and violence, let us reflect on the teachings of Pope John Paul II. 79. The Spirit: Principal of Peace (May 29, 1991) We have reflected the articles 1,2 and 3 last week. This week we have 4 and 5. Next week we will conclude the Catechesis 79 with 6 and 7.

4. According to St. Paul peace is a "fruit of the Holy Spirit" connected with charity: "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace..." (Gal 5:22). It is opposed to the works of the flesh, among which (according to the Apostle) are "hostilities, arguing, jealousy, outbursts of rage, selfish rivalries, dissensions, factions, envy..." (Gal 5:20).

This is a list of primarily interior obstacles which impede peace of soul and social peace.

Precisely because he transforms interior dispositions, the Holy Spirit inspires a basic attitude of peace in the world, too. Paul says of Christ that "he is our peace" (Eph 2:14) and explains that Christ has made peace by reconciling all people with God through his sacrifice, from which one new man is born upon the ashes of human dissension and hostility. But the Apostle himself adds that this peace is accomplished in the Holy Spirit: "Through Christ we have access in one Spirit to the Father" (Eph 2:18). It is always the one, true peace of Christ, but is poured into hearts and experienced under the impulse of the Holy Spirit.

5. In the Letter to the Philippians the Apostle speaks of peace as a gift given to those who, even in the difficulties of life, turn to God "in every form of prayer and in petitions full of gratitude...." He assures them: "God's own peace, which is beyond all understanding, will stand guard over your hearts and minds, in Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:6-7).

The lives of the saints serve as a testimony and proof of this divine origin of peace. They remain inwardly serene amidst the most painful trials and the storms that seem to overwhelm them. Something—or rather, Someone—is present and at work within them, shielding them from the surging waves of external vicissitudes, as well as from their own weakness and fear. It is the Holy Spirit who is the author of this peace—a peace that is the fruit of the love He infuses into their hearts. (cf. Summa Theol., II-II, q. 29, aa. 3-4).

Todos poseemos una cierta «naturaleza» cuando decimos: «es mi naturaleza». Una persona puede poseer una naturaleza, pero no a la inversa. «Persona» y «naturaleza» responden a dos preguntas diferentes. «¿Qué es?» — NATURALEZA. «¿Quién es?» — PERSONA. Además, todos podemos comprender que nuestra naturaleza determina lo que es posible para nosotros, las personas. Yo soy la persona; la naturaleza es la fuente de nuestras operaciones (F. J. Sheed). Lo mismo se aplica a la Trinidad. En este punto, debemos tener cuidado con lo siguiente: 1. Estas tres personas no comparten la naturaleza divina en una proporción del 33,333 %; 2. Son distintas, pero no están separadas.

La doctrina solo tiene sentido si se comprende en términos de Amor, y no en términos de administración.
